THE RECTOR'S LETTER:

Giving of ourselves.

Dear Friends,

Most of us like something to look forward to. Whether it is simply getting to the weekend after a busy week, spending time with friends or family, a much-needed holiday, watching a show or seeing our favourite football team winning, it's good to have plans in the diary.

In Chichester there always seems to be things going on. June sees the start of the Festival of Chichester - it's great that at St. Paul's we are able to host some of the concerts – and at the Cathedral the 2026 Festival of Flowers take place from the 2nd - 6th June. I'm always impressed at the level of organisation that goes into making so many wonderful events happen locally. And what is so good is that often there is a mixture of both paid staff and volunteers that make these things work so smoothly. This adds to a real sense of community.

One of the challenges of many of our local organisations and groups though is that sometimes it's getting harder to find volunteers. There are all sorts of reasons for that of course. Often people's priorities change depending on work or family commitments. And sometimes we haven't either thought about volunteering, or we haven't been asked to help.

At St Paul's, just like in all churches, there is a need for people to volunteer. We are very well served by some amazing people who arrange the flowers, or sing in the choir, set up for services or make coffee after the 10am service on Sunday. But we can always do with a few more people to help. Over the next few months, we will be looking at starting a new welcome team for services, as well as recruiting new servers to assist at the altar and those who help with the sound at our services too. And we also need a second Church Warden! There are a couple of other special volunteer roles we want to recruit for too. It would be great if someone volunteered to be a link person between our church and our link parish in Alt-Schöneberg in Berlin. Finally, we would love to gain a bronze and silver Eco Church award and would be very grateful if a small team could be found to take that forward, very much building on the brilliant work that has been done here in the past.

In St Paul's 2nd letter to the Corinthians, he writes – *'The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.'*

He was of course talking about giving money to those in need. Making donations to charities, and indeed the church, is really important if we can afford to do so. But what if we also look at what St Paul said as including the giving of our time or our talents as volunteers? St Paul is right; whatever we have to offer we mustn't give it just because we feel under pressure to do so. We should only give of our time, talents, or our money because we are able and willing. But if more of us could give just a little, then I know from my own experience we will look forward to volunteering in whatever small way that is. And our brilliant community will be just a little bit better too.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR MINISTRY

NEW MUSIC AT ST PAUL'S

One of the biggest joys of being a church musician is being able to introduce, or commission, new musical works for the congregation of St Paul's. It has been some time since we added a new mass setting, the last being the Mass of the Bread of Life by Margaret Rizza. This Trinity Sunday we will start singing The St Helen's Mass by Joanna Forbes L'Estrange. The skill of writing a congregational setting is to make it easily accessible for the people (not too high/low or rhythmically technical), but also have enough interest for the choir. Joanna, with her musical career starting in the Swingle Singers, manages to do both with ease. The setting is in a light jazz style, but in no way disrespectful to the words. I do hope you'll enjoy it - please feel free to tell me your thoughts!

The RSCM have named Sunday 14th June as Music Sunday: a chance to give thanks for all the music that enhances worship throughout the whole country. Whether it is a simple Taize chant or Bach's B Minor Mass (the greatest work ever written in my humble opinion) there is no doubt that music lifts our praise. It was St Augustine of Hippo who said: He who sings praises, not only praises, but also praises joyfully! With this in mind we are very grateful to Victoria Larley, who has written a new anthem for this day. When In Our Music God Is Glorified - words by the Methodist minister Fred Pratt Green, and written in 1971. She takes the verses of the hymn, and creates different moods to reflect the words of each stanza. It is unaccompanied, and varies from one to eight parts. We will perform this anthem again in the cathedral for the College of Canons evensong on 23rd September.

Finally, if you enjoy the choir singing and want to be part of it (but are too shy to ask) the choir is always on the look out for new singers - adults or children. Please do chat to me on a Sunday or by email: choir@stpaulschichester.org

NEW BOOKS IN THE CHURCH LIBRARY

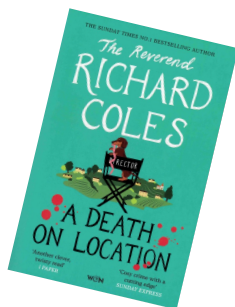
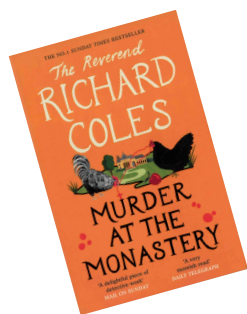
Eagle-eyed library users might spot that there are a few more books in the library now, and this article is just to tell you about a few that arrived in May.

The author of the first one will be familiar to many people. Sarah Manouch attended this church for most of her life, together with her sister Kathy and her mother Kit. Sarah was ordained just over eleven years ago, and is now Rector of East Dean, Singleton and West Dean. During Covid, she started a blog, **Rector's Ramblings**, which are short musings on life in a rural Rectory. Her book, published at the end of last year, covers events including the death of Queen Elizabeth II and the coronation of her son, natural disasters, and the day-to-day life of a Priest, part-time Assistant Manager of St Olave's, and occasional Cathedral Day Chaplain.

Having a good Fiction section is quite important in a library. Fiction reveals truth about life which we don't always see in our daily living, and it also tells us that others don't see the world as we do. We now have the full set of the Catherine Fox novels, and an almost complete set of the novels by Richard Coles, the radio and television presenter and priest. The books are delightful, often funny, and reveal the life of an Anglo-Catholic priest.

Finally, **Don't Forget We're Here Forever: A new generation's search for religion** by Lamorna Ash explores the phenomenon of a new generation finding religion for itself, in an age of increasing disconnection and apathy. 'Written with lyrical beauty and sensitivity, this is a reminder of our universal need for nourishment of the soul.'

'LET US PRAY.....'

One of the things that is at the heart of our faith is prayer. It's something that we sometimes do without thinking about it. Praying for others can simply be bringing our thoughts before God, whether that's when we are watching the news or when we have spoken to a friend or family member who is struggling with an illness or a situation that's hard.

As a Church we bring these concerns before God each week in our intercessions at our 10am Eucharists on Sundays and Thursdays. But there are times in our own prayers when its helpful to have an area of life to focus on. So each month we publish a list of things that people can pray for at home, or wherever they pray. These themes will sometimes be used by those who lead our intercessions on a Sunday too. The particular areas of prayer for June are noted below – do use them in your own prayers.

Prayer for the month

*Thanks be to thee, O Lord Jesus Christ,
for all the benefits which thou hast given me,
for all the pains and insults which thou hast borne for me:
O most merciful Redeemer, Friend and Brother,
may I know thee more clearly,
love thee more dearly,
and follow thee more nearly. Amen.*

The Feast of St Richard falls on the 16th of June, now also known as Sussex Day, and with his shrine in Chichester cathedral, it would seem right for us to focus our thoughts on his famous prayer. St Richard's shrine is a place where many of us, along with countless pilgrims, have lit candles and prayed. And undoubtedly many of us have recited his prayer. And it is a prayer that can, and has, inspired many. From choral anthems to a song in the 1970's musical 'Godspell', and to the vision statement for the Diocese of Chichester – 'To know, love and follow Jesus,' St Richard's famous prayer remains a favourite. But in some ways, it's not an easy prayer. In thanking Jesus for all he has done for us and in recognising him as our redeemer and friend, we then ask that we may know, love and follow him. It's a prayer then in which we ask Jesus to help us grow closer to him, and to become the person he longs for us to be. And it's a prayer of profound gratitude. Perhaps then it's a prayer that is as demanding as it is inspiring. But as we seek to grow in faith, it's a prayer that can touch our hearts in a way that few others can. In June let's make it our own and pray it often.



MOTHERS' UNION CELEBRATES 150 YEARS!

Mothers' Union was started 150 years ago by Mary Sumner, wife of the Vicar of Alresford in Hampshire. On becoming a grandmother, she recalled how much she would have benefitted from a group of mothers giving mutual support, so she invited women from her husband's parish to a meeting at the vicarage. From that modest beginning in 1876, the Christian movement for mothers that she started grew into the global organisation that flourishes today.

There are now 4 million members, women, men, married, single and divorced, working in 84 countries worldwide, seeking to bring an end to poverty, violence and injustice by demonstrating the Christian faith in action through nurture and support of the family, in all its many forms.

In various parts of the world, women are enabled to set up small businesses and Savings and Credit Groups, children are provided with breakfast clubs, students are befriended, home visits are made to the housebound, and prisoners are given bibles.

In Chichester Diocese members maintain caravans at Selsey and Winchelsea, where families in need of a break can have a holiday. They raise awareness of Modern Day Slavery and domestic violence issues, knit hats for premature babies, provide wash bags for people admitted to hospital unexpectedly, help staff the play area for children visiting Ford Prison, and maintain links with overseas members. A regular commitment is to provide a welcome and refreshments at the Citizenship Ceremonies held in Brighton, Lewes, Crowborough, Eastbourne and Hastings.

St Paul's and City of Chichester Mothers' Union has 8 members, 5 of whom are able to attend meetings held usually on third Thursdays at 11am in St Paul's Church. These are open to all, and we are particularly grateful for support when there is a speaker, four or five times a year.

The meeting this month has been moved the Saturday 20th June. There will be a service in St Wilfrid's Church, Durnford Close, Parklands at 2pm, followed by a cream tea. Members from other local branches will be attending and we would all be delighted to welcome you as we celebrate 150 years of Mothers' Union.

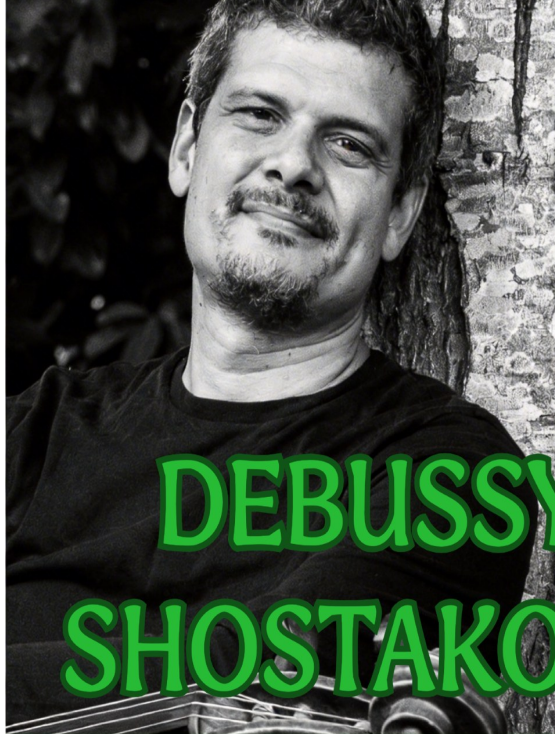
